Big companies on the way

Auto glass maker Fuyao buys part of former GM plant in Moraine.

MORAINE — The glass for one in four autos sold in America will be manufactured on a 100-acre site in Moraine as a result of the deal finalized Thursday with Fuyao, the Chinese automotive glass maker that pledges to put 800 workers there within three to five years.

Fuyao paid \$15 million for 1.2 million square feet of what was once a General Motors assembly plant.

The site at Ohio 741 and West Stroop Road is poised to become Fuyao's largest plant and possibly the heart of its \$400 million U.S. research and development center, said Cao Dewang, Fuyao's chairman, who made a surprise visit Thursday to the I-70/75 Economic Development Association's annual summit at Sinclair Community College.

Asked about a possible R&D center, Jeff Hoagland, president and chief executive of the Dayton Development Coalition, said, "We have a shot at it."

The coalition worked with the state's private development arm, JobsOhio, for about a year to draw Fuyao (pronounced "Fwee-yow") to the area.

Procter & Gamble coming to new facility near Dayton airport.

UNION — Procter & Gamble called its Dayton-area distribution center ideally situated to both leverage the company's scale and its reworked supply chain operations.

The Cincinnati-based consumer goods giant was revealed Thursday by state officials as the tenant going into the 1 million-square-foot distribution center being built near the Dayton International Airport.

"The new distribution center is part of a significant supply chain transformation in North America, that will dramatically innovate the way we supply our customers," said Yannis Skoufalous, P&G's global product supply officer.

The \$90 million distribution center will employ 800 employees and hiring will likely begin in November, said Lynn Anderson, vice president of communications for Exel, the company that will handle logistics at the facility.

The company expects to work with the Montgomery County Jobs Center and others to find the best employees,

VA chief resists calls for FBI investigation

Secretary Shinseki says inspector general's report due in 3 weeks.

WASHINGTON — Facing calls to resign, Veterans Affairs Secretary Eric Shinseki said Thursday that he hopes to have a preliminary report within three weeks on how widespread treatment delays and falsified patient scheduling reports are at VA facilities nationwide, following allegations that up to 40 veterans may have died while awaiting treatment at the Phoenix VA center.

Shinseki resisted calls from a Democratic senator to bring in the Justice Department and FBI for a criminal inves-

tigation. Shinseki said he first wanted to see results of the audit and a report on the VA inspector general's office on its investigation of the Phoenix hospital.

Sen. Richard Blumenthal, D-Conn., said there appears to "solid evidence of wrongdoing within the VA system" that could be criminal.

"It's a pattern and practice, apparently, of manipulating lists and gaming the system — in effect, cooking the books, creating false records," Blumenthal said, adding that the VA's inspector general lacked the proper resources to pursue a criminal investigation.

"The more I learn about the misconduct and impropriety at the VA medical facility, the more concerned I am

Report: Center paid improper leave time

Ohio IG says employees of juvenile rehab facility got \$69K worth.

An investigation by the Ohio Inspector General found employees of a juvenile rehabilitation center in Xenia received as much as \$69,641 worth of improper leave time and found instances where employees were granted two days of birthday leave a year.

The report recommended that the Ohio Department of Youth Services work with the Miami Valley Juvenile Rehabilitation Center to determine how much of the leave was improperly granted and how much is a matter of poor record keeping.
